THE NEED



Addiction has always been a major issue in our county, but following the pandemic and the increase of lethal drugs like fentanyl, overdoses and addiction-related crime are on the rise. At the same time, recovery housing in Skagit County (and affordable housing as a whole) is scarce.

When we first began New Earth Recovery in 2011, graduates of our program could find employment and afford a small apartment.

Now, because of soaring rental costs and limited spaces, our graduates have nowhere to go. The need to expand our entry-level houses and operate more secondstep houses—which do not limit length of stay—is critical.

GENESIS RELAPSE PREVENTION COACHING

Genesis Relapse Prevention coaching, where resident explore the origins of addictive behaviors, is critical to long-term success. Residents meet weekly in Genesis groups, and receive coaching one-on-one with Genesis volunteer coaches.






